Horizon announces further senior management appointments

Horizon Nuclear Power has today announced three senior management appointments, as it continues a major programme of organisational development.

The company plans to develop and construct at least 5,200MW of new nuclear power generation with the first plant, on Anglesey, coming online in the first half of the 2020s.

Anthony Webb joins the company as Director of Assurance and Safety; Janet Wilson as Director of Licensing and Permissions and Martin Hough as Head of Design Authority.

Anthony Webb joins from Jacobs Engineering where he has been serving as Director of Operations, Nuclear & Defence and Head of Nuclear Assurance since 2008. Prior to his role at Jacobs, Anthony held executive posts at Energy Solutions EU Ltd including SVP Regulatory and Nuclear and Amersham International/GE Healthcare as Site Director and VP Nuclear Assurance. He has recently supported EDF and NNB GenCo's senior management team in their Nuclear Site Licence application for Hinkley Point C through their Nuclear Safety Committee, Operational Executive and Board. During his career Anthony has held a number of Board and other non-executive positions, including a period on the Government's Nuclear Safety & Advisory Committee (NuSAC). In 2012 he was appointed an Independent Member of Horizon's pre Nuclear Safety Committee.

Dr Janet Wilson joins from Atkins where she has been Associate Director of Energy since 2011, focusing on new build licensing. Prior to this, Janet held a range of senior posts with the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority (NDA). She left the NDA as Director of Safety and Assurance, a high profile role, which required frequent interactions with Government, Regulators and industry. Janet brings with her longstanding nuclear industry expertise. Having begun her nuclear career on AGR reactors in commissioning, safety cases and design, Janet spent 17 years with the Nuclear Installations Inspectorate (now the Office for Nuclear Regulation) in a variety of senior roles.

Martin Hough joins from Jacobs UK Limited where he is currently Nuclear Assurance Director for Major Projects. In this role he has been an external independent member of the EDF Hinkley Point C Nuclear Safety Committee for over four years. Martin has extensive knowledge and experience in safety, engineering, technical support and commissioning across Magnox, AGR and PWR nuclear power stations. In 2002 he joined the Magnox senior executive team as leader of the Magnox central engineering function, initially as Head of Reactor Services and later as Head of Engineering and Technical Services.

Alan Raymant, Chief Operating Officer of Horizon, said: "I'm delighted to announce these appointments. Anthony, Janet and Martin bring a wealth of experience that will be invaluable as Horizon develops into a major UK utility and nuclear operator.

"Over the next few years we will be developing licence, consent and permit applications and building the organisation towards becoming a site licensed company with a strong nuclear safety culture. At the same time we'll be developing the detailed power plant design for our first site at Wylfa. These new appointees bring a mixture of capabilities and experience which will help drive the company forward to achieve these milestones, preparing us for the construction and operational phases of our projects".

Horizon's developments at Wylfa and Oldbury-on-Severn will represent multibillion pound investments in

the UK's infrastructure. Each is expected to create up to 6000 jobs at peak during the construction phase, and around 1000 during operation.

- Horizon Nuclear Power was formed in 2009 to develop new nuclear power stations in the UK. The company was acquired by Hitachi Ltd of Japan in November 2012 from previous joint owners RWE npower and E.ON UK.
- Horizon holds grid connection agreements and owns land suitable for the development of new nuclear power stations at Wylfa on the Isle of Anglesey and Oldbury-on-Severn in South Gloucestershire.
