Horizon will hold its first Open Surgery of 2012 at Cemaes Village Hall on 23 January, at which local people can ask questions about the company's plans for a new nuclear power station at Wylfa.

As with previous events, the January Open Surgery will give people the opportunity to meet the project team and find out more about the proposed new development.

The surgery will take place between 1pm and 7pm on 23 January at Cemaes Village Hall.

Alan Smith, Head of Site Development at Horizon Nuclear Power, said: "Our Open Surgeries proved increasingly popular in 2011 and we're looking forward to the first one of 2012. Horizon Nuclear Power Ltd. Horizon Nuclear Power is a joint venture established in 2009 by E.ON UK and RWE npower. The company is developing proposals for new nuclear power stations at Wylfa on the Isle of Anglesey and at Oldbury-on-Severn in

A new nuclear power station at Wylfa would deliver enough low carbon electricity for more than 5 million households. It is expected that around 5000 people would be employed during construction and around 800 permanent jobs during operation.
