Horizon to hold next Open Surgery on 18 July

Horizon Nuclear Power is giving local people the chance to learn more about the Wylfa Newydd Project by holding its next Open Surgery event at Amlwch Town Hall on Monday 18 July between 2.30pm and 6.30pm.

We've started the next stage of our archaeology studies, which follows the work that took place earlier this year. This will take place towards Wylfa Head and also along the proposed new sections of the A5025 at Valley, Llanfachraeth, Llanfaethlu and Cefn Coch. We've also started off-shore Ground Investigation studies at Porth y Pistyll, and are working to completing our new office extension in August.
